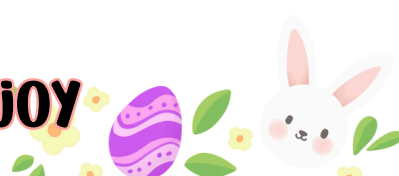

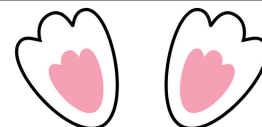

PUBLIC SAFETY POWER SHUTOFF

RESOURCES TO HELP DURING PSPS OUTAGES

To keep communities in high fire risk areas safe from the risk of wildfire, we might shut off power when there are high winds and very dry vegetation. These outages are called Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) and are only used as a last resort.

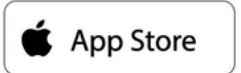

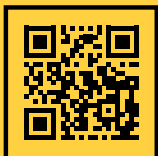


We will let you know when PSPS may happen, provide updates and let you know when the power will be restored.

If you're enrolled in the Medical Baseline Allowance program, and PSPS notifications are misdelivered or bounce back, we will follow up with you via phone or come to your door to make sure that you know that there may be a shutoff. Over the past several days, we've heard from many concerned residents about Southern California Edison's (SCE) power outages. Some of these outages drag on for more than a week and people are understandably frustrated, particularly our mountain communities, who rely on electricity to stay warm during these cold winter months. The outages are exceptionally harsh on our seniors. Unfortunately, the county has no control over these events due to current state-imposed regulations and that give local jurisdictions zero control over energy resources during such circumstances.

We certainly understand the threat of high winds, which can put significant strain on our energy infrastructure and increase fire danger and we are very fortunate to not have experienced any devastating emergencies, unlike our neighbors in Los Angeles County. However, it's clear that there are many issues with how SCE has managed this wind event. Many residents who live well outside the fire-prone areas are experiencing lengthy outages. In many instances, there has been little communication by SCE to its customers about when power will be restored. The lack of useful information by SCE has been alarming. SCE needs to have greater flexibility built into their circuits to minimize the number of customers who are impacted. In addition, the State of California continues its premature push for full electrification, which will only amplify the problem. The state needs to realize the impact of its policies on our communities and take action to ensure that what happened during this wind event does not become a new standard in our county.

While we continue to advocate for measures that allow us to more effectively address these issues at the local level, we encourage residents to prepare for potential outages by keeping emergency supplies on hand. The county has guidance and resources for residents at <https://prepare.sbcounty.gov/>. We also ask that you join us in advocating for reform at the state level. The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) regulates utility providers such as SCE, and it is important that they hear feedback from residents who have been harmed by these power outages. Complaints and concerns about SCE can be filed with the CPUC here. Since the state oversees Edison, we also encourage you to engage your state representatives on this matter. It is important that our legislators realize the severity of the situation and how these state regulations are failing our communities.



Beware of Scammers!

State and local officials are warning residents about new scams targeting California communities. These fraudulent schemes are designed to steal personal information and money, and they often use trusted systems like Amber Alerts, toll road notifications, and law enforcement communications to deceive victims.

Amber Alert Registration Scam

Scammers claim they can register children for the Amber Alert system. They request confidential data and suggest meeting at the potential victim's home.

Fact: Amber Alerts are managed solely by law enforcement to assist in finding missing children and require no registration. Action: Do not share personal information with unknown callers and report such calls to local law enforcement.

Toll Road Payment Scam

Fraudsters send text messages pretending to be from toll agencies, claiming consumers owe money for using toll roads or express lanes. These texts include links to fake websites designed to steal credit card information.

Fact: Legitimate toll notifications are sent by mail, never via text.

Action: Do not click on suspicious links or provide payment information online unless you've verified the sender.

Jury Duty or Warrant Scam

Scammers impersonate the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, claiming you missed federal jury duty and demanding personal information or payment via Zelle, gift cards, or Apple Pay. They may even spoof the department's actual non-emergency number to appear credible.

Fact: The Sheriff's Department does not call about jury duty, missed summons, or warrants, nor do they demand payment or personal details over the phone.

Action: Hang up immediately and report the call to local law enforcement.

With free SeeClickFix mobile app and web tools, citizens will now be able to provide County Public Works and Special Districts officials with pictures, videos, specific descriptions, and more. The SeeClickFix citizen reporting solution feeds valuable information needed to get the job done efficiently directly to the newly implemented centralized operations, asset and issue management system to manage issues from creation to resolution — engaging County citizens throughout the process.

How do I report an issue with SeeClickFix?

The SeeClickFix mobile app is available for download on Google Play Store for Android and Apple App Store for iPhone. In addition to the mobile apps, citizens can send reports to the SB County Public Works using the form below.

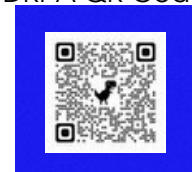
